

Science - Sound Energy

- a balloon or some cling wrap

Step 1: Cut the neck of the balloon and stretch it tight over the cup opening so that it is flat (like a drum). If you do not have a balloon, you can stretch some cling wrap very tightly over your cup or container.

Step 2: Once the balloon is secure on the cup, sprinkle salt (or sugar or rice) over the top of the balloon.



Steam rose up the chimney. The wolf got burnt and ran away. The three little pigs lived happily ever after.



And Tiddalick uttered a croak!


See eel was wriggling around so much,
