New Website Address

Being the largest system in the southern hemisphere NSW Department of Education is transitioning all schools to a new website service which will provide us with state of the art capabilities. National Consistent Collection on Data on School Students with Disability Notification for Parents and Carers

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the *Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability*. All Australian schools will collect data on their students who are receiving adjustments to meet additional learning and support needs in accordance with their obligations under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and *Disability Standards for Education 2005*. This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the education needs of students with disability. The data provided to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school. If parents have any questions about the collection, they can discuss it with their child's class teacher. I have placed an information sheet later in this newsletter.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability Notification for Parents and Carers

This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the education needs of students with disability.

The data provided to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.

Privacy Protection

The NSW Department of Education follows the requirements of the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998* and the *Health Records and Information Privacy Act 2002*. Schools will collect, record, store and use data about individual students in line with these requirements. Data security and protection is a priority and students' personal details will be kept confidential.

Under Clause 52 of the Commonwealth *Australian Education Regulation 2013*, data collected by the NSW Department of Education for the NCCD must be provided to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training. This includes the number of students at each level of education, the number in each category of disability and the number at each level of adjustment. The information is provided to the Commonwealth as a series of number sets that cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.

The Australian Government Department of Education and Training follows the requirements of the Commonwealth *Privacy Act 1988* when handling any data provided by NSW Department of Education in connection with the national data collection. A public information notice has been developed to by the Australian Government to provide students, parents and carers with important privacy information in relation to the data collection. On Thursday the 26th of July, the school held the athletics carnival at Tamplin Field Hobartville. It was fantastic day, which was enjoyed by all who attended.

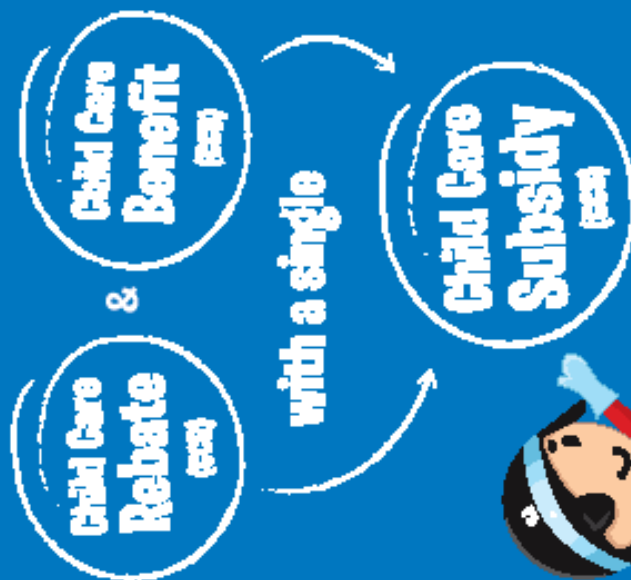

This handy checklist will help you get ready for the changes.

- ☐ If you don't already have one, register for a MyGov account, as this is how the government will communicate with you.
- ☐ Get organised with your tax returns. To get the right subsidy you will need to complete your tax return.
- ☐ If you are receiving Special Child Care Benefit, JFA or Grandparent Child Care Benefit payments, visit the Department of Education and Training website to find out exactly how these changes will impact you.
- ☐ Complete the CCS Assessment in the Centrelink section of your MyGov account
- ☐ Create your bookings with Camp Australia (if you haven't already)
- ☐ When prompted by the Government, log into your MyGov account and confirm the enrolments for Outside School Hours Care



A If you do not confirm your enrolments, you will have to pay the full fee.

Mexican Bean and Corn Dip

This quick and easy dip can be varied by adding cheese and/or diced fresh tomato on top.

It can also be served hot or cold.

You'll need:

- ☐ 2 tin of beans (use salt reduced baked beans or kidney beans)
- ☐ 1 tins corn
- ☐ 1 jar of salsa
- ☐ ½ grated cheese
- ☐ 5-6 medium cherry tomatoes diced or 1 tin of tomatoes

Method:

1. Refrigerate the cheese provided for 5 mins so that it is easier to grate.
2. Drain excess sauce off beans and corn but do not rinse.
3. Mix salsa and beans together.
4. Place grated cheese and tomato on top.
5. Serve a teaspoon of cold dip with crackers and/or vegetables.
7. Ready to eat. Enjoy!

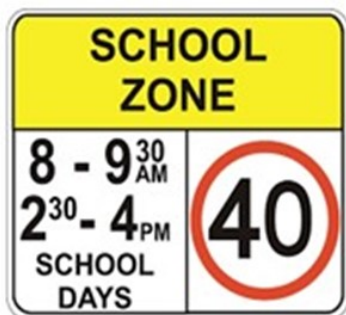

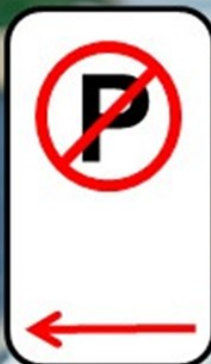

Skoolbag App

Our School now has our own Skoolbag iPhone and Android App to help us communicate more effectively with our Parent/Student community. Some of the features and benefits include:

- Parents can use the app to email change of details, and report when children are away sick

We are asking parents/students to install our Skoolbag School App.

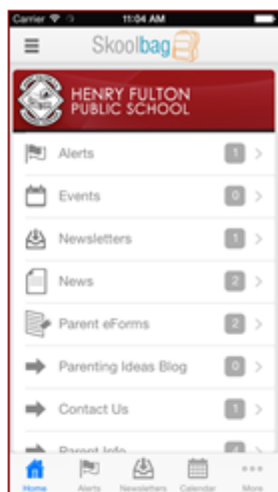
For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.
