Tree Planting

On Tuesday 26th June, 17 students from Stages 2 and 3 (Sustainability Committee Members and Indigenous students) visited Bungarrabee Park which is part of the Western Sydney Parklands. Greening Australia hosted our visit and facilitated our planting of over 600 plants in just one morning. We planted native plants which are endangered due to construction and development and created homes for specific native animals including bees, birds and lizards. We witnessed a Brown Cross Hawk hunting for prey and were given guides to the Birds of Western Sydney along with our sustainable gift bags and hats. We completed our day with a sense of satisfaction and pride, knowing that we had contributed to the goal of 20,000 plants being planted on this site in 2018.

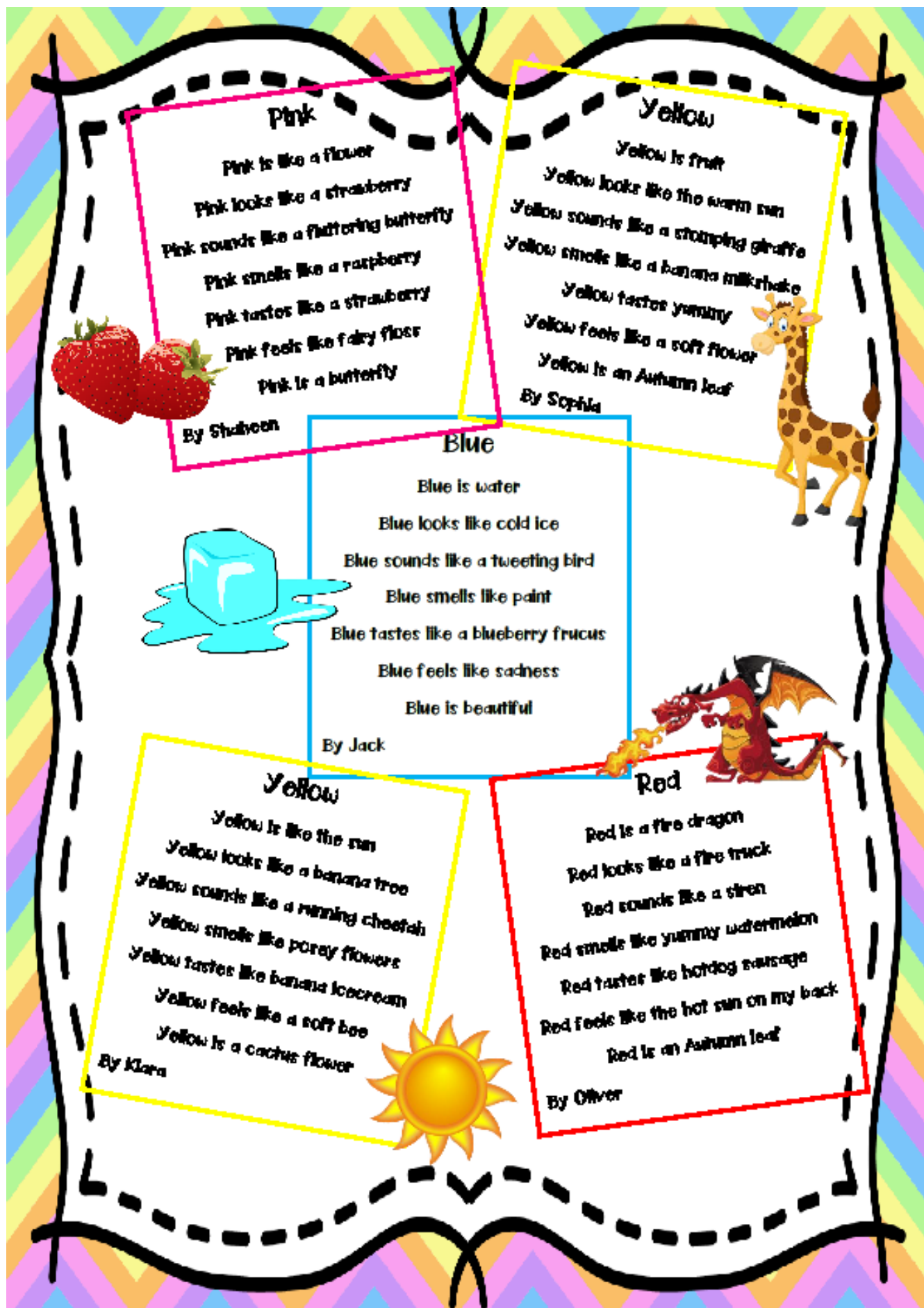

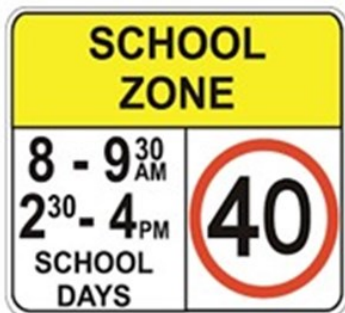

We are asking parents/students to install our Skoolbag School App.

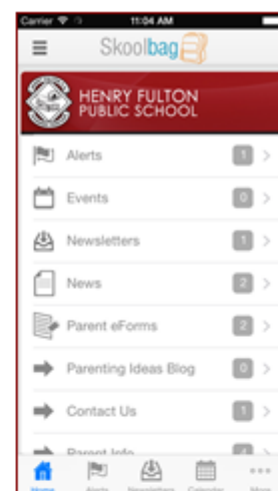
For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

CCS is coming! Upcoming Changes to Your Government Subsidy today to receive the appropriate subsidy!

Did you know that from Monday the 2nd of July the current fee assistance from the Government, CCR and CCB, will be replaced with a single Child Care Subsidy (CCS). Great news is this new subsidy will be available to all families using Camp Australia services!

CCS will affect the amount of fee assistance that each family will receive. A few things that will determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy are:

- Annual income will determine the percentage of subsidy a family is eligible for,
- An activity test will determine how many hours of subsidised care families can access, and
- The type of child care service will determine the hourly rate cap

To make sure you are ready for launch of CCS, you must enroll on the MyGov website: <https://my.gov.au/> and confirm your personal details. This will help determine how much assistance you will received.

Due to CCS being brand new, your details will not automatically rollover from previous years, to prevent any complications please resubmit your enrolment otherwise you may not receive any subsidy until you do so.
