...from the Principal's desk

In the last two weeks I have seen a positive change in the way parents are entering and exiting the school. I'd like to thank parents for supporting the school by keeping their children safe, modelling safe pedestrian behaviour, using the main gates and not entering the school car park. Thank you one and all.

However, we recently received some correspondence from Nepean Police Area Command, which I have placed later in the newsletter outlining the issues around illegal parking around schools. Our school is no exception as we often see illegally and dangerously parked cars and mis-use of the "kiss and drop" zones on both Vincent Road and Grays Lane. Please take note of this information from Police....

"A message from Police-ARE YOU SCHOOL SAFE - Illegal parking around schools endangers children's lives" and the "School Zone Parking Infringements".

Bus Safety

To further promote road safety, we have invited Busways to visit the school on Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd June with a bus and give a presentation on bus safety. A School Bus Safety Program presenter will educate students on several topics including waiting at bus stops, getting on and off a bus safely, safe behaviour whilst travelling and using bus passes. The presentation is free of charge and will be offered to all students K-6.

New walkway

In the coming weeks we will have a new walkway built outside the disabled toilet. It will extend from the existing COLA along the canteen wall. There will be some disruption to the entry area of the school as safety fencing will need to be placed around the work area. I will keep the community informed prior and during construction but request patience and cooperation once the work begins.

SRC Wacky Wednesday

On Wednesday 20th June the Student Representative Council are running a "Wacky Wednesday" fundraiser. All money raised will go toward some new benches and outdoor tables for our students so they will be asking for at least one or two gold coins on the day. Student can wear "wacky" clothes, socks, headbands and hair etc. *"The wackier the better"*. Appropriate clothing and closed shoes are a must.

A MESSAGE FROM POLICE



ARE YOU SCHOOL SAFE - "Illegal parking around schools endangers children's lives"

If you've heard the expression "it's only a matter of time until someone gets hurt" then you'll understand why it is important for EVERYONE to obey the road rules.

School opening and closing hours are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school.

Park safely even if it means walking further to the school gate. Schools provide information in school newsletters and emails to promote safe behaviour and this includes parking legally during drop off and pick up times.

Always take extra care in 40km/h school zones, which operate on gazetted school days. Observe all parking signs. They are planned with children's safety in mind.

Illegal parking around schools puts lives at risk. That's why Council and the Police take a 'zero tolerance' approach. Council Rangers, Parking Officers and Police regularly patrol schools across the Penrith LGA.

Parking in a No Parking area - means you can stop to drop off or pick up passengers for a MAXIMUM of 2 MINUTES. You must stay within 3 metres of the vehicle.

Parking in a No Stopping area - means you CANNOT stop in this area for ANY reason.

Parking in a Bus Zone area - means you CANNOT stop or park unless you are driving a bus.

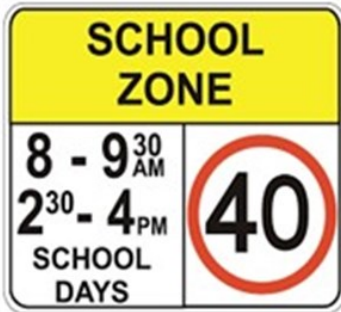

We are asking parents/students to install our Skoolbag School App.

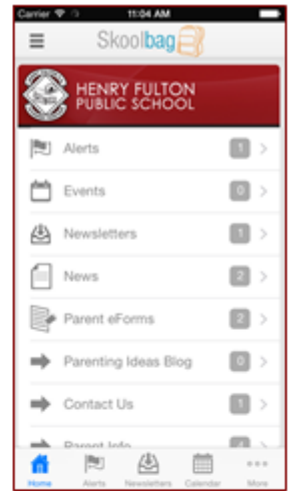
For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

Busways Bus Safety Presentation - 2018



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

As part of an ongoing priority to promote road safety amongst our students, classes from Kindergarten to Year 6 will be participating in a bus safety presentation. The School Bus Safety Program is presented by Busways School Bus Safety Trainers and is designed to educate students on:

- Waiting at bus stops
- Getting on and off the bus at school and at bus stops
- Safe behaviour whilst travelling on the bus
- Student code of conduct
- Using bus passes
- Telling the bus driver about problems on the bus
- Parent/carers responsibilities (waiting on the correct side of the road)
- Evacuation procedure in case of an emergency
- The role of public transport in the community.

Students will have the opportunity to engage in activities and demonstrations whilst on board a Busways bus, which will remain parked at our school bus bay on Vincent Road. Each child will be presented with a certificate and activity pack after their safety session.

When: Wednesday 20th June and Thursday 21st June 2018 – various times throughout the school day.

Cost: Free

As this presentation will occur on our school site and in the bus bay a permission note is not required however if you do not give permission for your child to participate, please inform your child's teacher.
